I am writing to provide important information about a proposed project in the Fraser Surrey Port Lands area.

BHP Billiton Canada Inc. (BHP) is a leading global resources company with assets and projects in iron ore, petroleum, copper and coal. BHP proposes to construct a potash export facility at Fraser Surrey Docks in Surrey, B.C. to export potash from the proposed Jansen mine in Saskatchewan. The new facility would receive and store rail shipments of potash and then load onto bulk ocean-going vessels.

We are in the preliminary review phase of the Project and Environmental Review process with the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority. Please find attached a letter and an information sheet. The Preliminary Public Comment Period will run for 20 business days from 12 October to 8 November 2017.
